Edward T. Rogowsky Internship Program in Government & Public Affairs – The City University of New York

OVERVIEW

The New York City Internship Program in Government and Public Affairs is coordinated by ETR Internship Program and operates on all the CUNY college campuses. Internship faculty on each campus provide students with guided and rigorous academic course work to produce a theoretically grounded, yet practical understanding of New York City government and public affairs.



Students are placed throughout the five boroughs, in governmental and non-governmental agencies and organizations. Students are able to network, gain office experience and begin grasp the culture of public service professionals.

All majors are encouraged to apply.

Students should apply to participate in the program prior to the internship. Each campus has requirements for participation which need to be met. The internship runs for the length of the semester and includes attendance at the CUNY Forum, a panel discussion broadcast on CUNY-TV (Channel 75, NYC TV) on a different policy issue each month of the semester.

KEY POINTS:

- Students intern a minimum of 10 hours per week.
- Students take seminar at least once per week.
- Students attend three CUNY Forums.
- Students contact College Faculty Coordinator prior to registering for the course.
- All majors may apply.
